Blessed Trinity and St. Patrick Parishes
“Let’s Stay Connected!”

Blessed Trinity and St. Patrick Parishes now have an official Facebook page! This exciting Internet tool provides a quick and effective means for people to stay in touch with parish-related news and events. This tool is also a great way for us to respond to parish and community needs.

Here are details of the parish Facebook page:

- It’s a way to automatically receive timely updates about parish and related news, events and emergencies to your Facebook account.
- We’ll do our best to post only relevant information on the parish Facebook page.
- Facebook is free. All you need is a computer and an Internet connection.
- You can choose to receive or stop receiving parish Facebook postings to your Facebook account at any time.

There are two ways to access the parish Facebook page:

1. If you do not have a personal Facebook account, you can access the parish Facebook from the Parish web site <http://www.blessed-trinity-parish.org> by clicking on the Facebook tab (on the left side of the page).
2. If you already have a Facebook account or would like to create a Facebook account:
 - a. Log into Facebook.

Note: If you are new to Facebook, you’ll first need to “Sign up” to create an account. It’s easy ... Using a web browser (like Internet Explorer or Firefox), first get to the Facebook login screen <http://www.facebook.com>. Then fill in your name, email address and a Facebook password. That’s it!

b. After you are logged in, search for “*blessed trinity and st. patrick parish*”

c. Look for the Blessed Trinity Parish and St Patrick Parish logo:



d. Place your mouse over this entry (it is the one listed as 300 Main Street, Owego, NY 13827) and click on it. You have now connected to the parish Facebook page!

e. At the top of the parish Facebook page, click on the small box that is labeled “Like.” “Like” is a way to connect with the parish Facebook page. That is, any information posted on the **parish** Facebook page will automatically be posted on **your** Facebook home page.
